Consequently, we chose to use some of these proceeds together with donations from other sponsors/donors/grant providers to purchase and install a memorial chair at the George Brown Botanical Gardens in honour of these lovely ladies.

The remaining proceeds were deposited into the NTBCV general account and into the NTBCV Kerry Milsom Trust Fund to pay for the cost of cleaning, gardening, power and taxi fares as well as weekend respite and two weeks accommodation for approved recipients. Those recipients who required assistance or accommodation were all referred to NTBCV by the breast care nurses.

The Nightcliff Football Club donated half of the proceeds to NTBCV and we would like to extend our sincerest thanks to the Club and especially to Sandy Kickett, Club Development Manager, Damien Hale, coach of Nightcliff Tigers Premier League for organising the event and the three gorgeous footy "hunks who modelled the shirts. Not only does this type of fundraiser provide valuable funds to NTBCV to pay for assistance and aids for people undergoing breast cancer treatment and for those in terminal stages, it's a wonderful opportunity to spread the message about breast awareness and the need to be ever vigilant.

Clubhouse Territory

Clubhouse Territory held an "Eat, Drink and be Merry" fundraiser at Pavonia Place on Wednesday the 25th March and NTBCV, received a generous donation on behalf of BRASNT. 10,000 steps programme

In April this year an email was sent to members to gauge interest in NTBCV running a 10,000 steps programme this year, this being the 6th year that NTBCV supported 10,000 steps. The response was an overwhelming YES!!!!! The first walk was planned to coincide with Mother's Day Classic on Sunday the 10th May. Up at the crack of dawn scores of intrepid runners, walkers and 10,000 steppers met at Mindil beach, danced in the rising sun to the rhythmic sounds of zumba and then set off on the 4km or 8km walk/run. As in previous years NTBCV provided a small incentive to encourage 10,000 steppers improve their average number of steps per week. Breast Cancer Network of Australia National Summit 16/17 July 2015

The Breast Cancer Network Australia held a summit in Melbourne on 16th &17th July 2015. NTBCV members Jennie, Sharyn & Vicki attended. There were also representatives from other Breast Cancer Support Services ie. Belladonnas & Flamingo Belles. The summit had 5 different streams and the 3 of us joined the stream entitled "Engaging Culturally Diverse Communities". The other streams were "Engaging Online Communities", "Practical Support Initiatives", "Active and Well" and "Healthy and effective peer support groups". We had 2 other Darwin ladies join us and they attended the "Active and Well" stream. Our stream "Engaging Culturally Diverse Communities" went through a variety of strategies on how to engage our variety of different cultural groups. We looked at how to engage with community leaders which takes time, trust and respect. Our team leader speakers were from different ethnic groups and talked about their cultures and the best ways to engage them. We are now making contact with different community groups so we can attend their social or regular meetings to talk to them about what is available and how we can help them or direct them to help.

Government House Luncheon

Every year the Administrator of the Northern Territory hosts a luncheon at Government House for Territorians newly diagnosed with breast cancer. This tradition has taken place on a yearly basis since the first luncheon hosted by Mrs Lesley Conn in 2000. As in previous years, the 2015 Luncheon was held in October to coincide with Breast Cancer Awareness month. For the first time Mrs Marie Hardy, wife of newly appointed Administrator, Mr John Hardy hosted the event and gave a lovely speech and a very warm welcome to all who attended. All in all, everyone had a fabulous time and in the words of one of this year's attendees:

Following the cutting of the ribbon we held a mini-field of women where those present joined in placing the pink





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ladies and blue man in position on the Heritage Garden lawn. Participants were then invited to stay for a light picnic lunch.
